INTRODUCTION

Miami's Center for Architecture and Design (MCAD) is pleased to announce the 'Housing + Accessory Dwelling Unit' design competition, presented by AARP.

Miami's breathtaking natural beauty provides a unique canvas for architects and designers to create affordable housing solutions for the local community. The 'Housing+ Accessory Dwelling Unit' competition, organized by AIA / MCAD, offers a rare chance to craft an idea and experience that embodies regenerative living in this beautiful landscape.

This competition is not just an opportunity, it's a chance to make a significant impact on the Miami landscape. By creating a small yet powerful addition to the urban housing condition, you can bring housing affordability through thoughtful design and create a more resilient place for all.

THE COMPETITION

Participants will design a small-scale Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) to be added to an existing single-family home. This structure should seamlessly blend functionality with the enchanting neighborhood aesthetics, offering comfortable and resilient living space for those 50+ while framing views of the surrounding environment. The ADU must integrate features such as a living area, a place to sleep, a changing room, a toilet, a bathing area, and one exterior wall without openings.

The competition is open to all.

No professional qualification is required. Design proposals can be developed individually or by teams (with a maximum of 4 team members). Participants must be living in Miami. This is your chance to be a part of something significant, regardless of your background or experience.



MIAMI

Miami is a vibrant coastal city, influenced by a diverse population from around the world. It has been nicknamed the "Capital of Latin America" because of its high population of Spanish speakers. With more than 6M residents in Downtown Miami alone, Miami is the second largest metropolitan city in the southeast after Atlanta and the ninth largest in the United States.

Miami is also known as the "Magic City" for seemingly popping up overnight due to its young age and massive growth. It is split roughly into north, south, west, and Downtown areas. The heart of the city is Downtown Miami, which is on the eastern side and includes the neighborhoods of Brickell, Virginia Key, Watson Island, and PortMiami. The southern side of Miami includes the neighborhoods of Coral Way, The Roads, and Coconut Grove.

The western side of Miami includes the neighborhoods of Little Havana, West Flagler, and Flagami. The northern side of Miami includes Midtown, Edgewater, Wynwood, the Design District and the Upper Eastside.

There are two basic seasons in Miami, a hot and wet season from May through October, and a warm and dry season from November through April.
